

28 Employees Get Initial Awards In Employee of the Year Program

Chapter Employee of the Year certificates will be awarded to 28 state employees throughout Oregon in the first phase of OSEA's program to select a State Employee of the Year for 1971.

The certificates, signed by Gov. Tom McCall, OSEA President Richard F. Young and local chapter presidents, will be sent to chapters for presentation to recipients later this month.

The program was begun four years ago by OSEA's Public Relations Committee. Awards are made on three levels: chapter, district and state.

After selection by local chapters, employees compete for District Employee of the Year awards. One recipient will be chosen in each of the Association's nine districts.

The State Employee of the Year will be selected from among the nine district recipients. He will be named by Gov. Tom McCall at OSEA's awards banquet in Salem on January 22.

Both district and the state recipients will be chosen by panels of non-state employee judges. Membership in OSEA is not required to be nominated or selected for an award at any level.
