

Need Information on Tax Plan? Call 1-800-452-0330

Citizens throughout Oregon may learn how the tax measure on the May 1 ballot will affect them by completing the form printed below and telephoning this toll-free number: 1-800-452-0330.

That number will reach the Department of Revenue in Salem. By using the information on the form, the agency will compute the tax an individual would pay under the property tax relief and school finance program that has been referred to the people by the legislature.

"One of the greatest responsibilities the state has is to inform voters fully to allow them to make good judgments," Gov. Tom McCall said in announcing the service.

"The voters have been asked to vote on May 1 on a property tax relief program, and it is essential that

they have as much information about the proposed law as it is humanly possible to give," he declared.

The governor said citizens may call from anywhere within the state, free of charge. The cost of the telephone service will be paid by the Department of Revenue.

"It is appropriate for the department to provide taxpayers with accurate, unbiased information about taxes. The department consults with taxpayers every day of the year to assist them. That is a service the state must provide to keep taxpayers informed," he said.

McCall said he anticipates there will be opposition to the telephone service. "Some of those opposed to property tax relief don't want the people to know about the benefits they will receive from approval of the

ballot measure. Opponents of this program may very well carry on a campaign of confusion and sloganeering."

"We don't fear the facts," he said. "We want voters to have a chance to evaluate this measure."

Before calling the toll-free number, citizens should complete the following form. It gives the Department of Revenue information needed in order to compute the estimated effects of the tax program for homeowners, renters, and businesses. Estimated tax changes will be based on 1972 income and property values.

Citizens may call the toll-free number from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week, until election day, or mail the form to McCall Plan, Box 1973, Salem, Oregon, 97308, prior to April 25.
