## OSEA Board Adopts Program To Reduce State Travel by 15%

A program outlining steps that should be taken by state government and the state's 30,000 employes to help ease the energy shortage has been adopted by OSEA's Board of Directors and sent to Gov. Tom McCall.

To implement the program the board asked McCall to appoint an Energy Conservation and Service Protection Council composed of legislators, agency heads and employes or their representatives.

The program recommends state government conserve energy by taking the following steps:

- An across-the-board reduction of 15 per cent in state travel, including both state automobiles and employe autos used on state business.
- Formation and use of car pools by state employes, including establishment of incentives such as free parking or reduced parking fees at state facilities.
- Expansion of the state's present shuttle system between Salem and other cities with free or low cost fares.
- Increased use of public transportation by state employes, including establishment of incentives such as reimbursement of fares to those employes who use public transportation.
- A reduction in work days or work weeks where it can be demonstrated that the same service can be provided to the public.

## Gasoline Tax Hike Opposed by Board

A resolution opposing control of gasoline consumption by increased taxes or prices was approved by OSEA's Board of Directors meeting in Salem recently.

The resolution suggests "consideration of other, fairer alternatives, including but not limited to gasoline rationing" to reduce consumption.

The board urged OSEA chapters and district councils as well as the Assembly of Governmental Employes and the Western Assembly of Governmental Employes to adopt similar resolutions.

Copies of the resolution will be sent to President Nixon, Oregon's congressional delegation and Gov. Tom McCall.

## Guarriello Named To District Post

Nicholas Guarriello, a member of Success Chapter 30 in Portland, was installed as assistant director of District One by James J. Kinns, OSEA's secretary-treasurer, at the Board of Directors meeting last week.

He fills the vacancy created when David D. Saunders, Beaver Chapter 31, the former assistant director, was elected director of membership at the 1973 General Council.

Guarriello works for the Employment Division. He is serving his second term as president of Chapter 30, and has served as a delegate and alternate delegate to the General Council.

The program adopted by OSEA's board also recommends changes in two of the practices instituted by state government recently to conserve energy:

- Reconsideration of the limitations put upon heat, hot water and lighting which impair the ability of employes to perform effective work or which contribute to unhealthy or unsafe working conditions.
- Restoration of custodial work from daytime to night shifts.

In addition, the board asked Gov. McCall to introduce legislation in the coming special session of the legislature to boost the state's reimbursement rate for employes who use their automobiles on state business.

The board called the current rate of 10-cents a mile "inadequate," and said if it isn't raised the increase in gasoline prices will soon make it impossible for employes to use their private autos.

## Salem Employes Begin New Bowling League for Women

A new bowling league for female state employes has begun in Salem. Any woman employed by the state is invited to join.

The league bowls on Tuesday evenings at Town and Country Bowl. Cost is \$2.50 a week. New bowlers will be permitted to join through January. Free bowling lessons are offered to beginning bowlers.
