

# 28 State Employees Cited in OSEA's Awards Program

"Chapter Employee of the Year" certificates will be awarded to 28 state employees from throughout Oregon in the first phase of OSEA's program to select Oregon's "State Employee of the Year" for 1973.

The certificates, signed by Gov. Tom McCall, OSEA President Lester B. Strickler and local chapter presidents, will be sent to chapters for presentation early next month.

The program was initiated six years ago by the Association's Public Relations Committee. Awards are made on three levels: chapter, district and state.

After selection by local chapters, employees compete for "District Employee of the Year" awards. One recipient will be chosen in each of OSEA's nine districts.

The 1973 "State Employee of the Year" will be selected from among the nine district recipients. That individual will be named at OSEA's awards banquet in Salem on January 26.

Both the state and district recipients will be chosen by panels of non-state employee judges. Membership in the Association is not required to be nominated or selected for an award at any level.

# OSEA Scholarship Applicants Face March 1 Deadline

The deadline is fast approaching for students who want to apply for an OSEA scholarship or grant-in-aid for the 1974-75 school year.

Applications must be in no later than March 1.

OSEA members may nominate themselves or one other individual of their choosing for an award. The eligibility requirement was liberalized by delegates at the 1973 General Council. In past years, OSEA members could only nominate themselves or immediate members of their families.

Each applicant must be sponsored by a local chapter, and the sponsoring chapter must contribute to the scholarship fund in order for the applicant to be eligible for an award.

To apply, each applicant must submit two forms -- an OSEA certification form and a financial aid application.

Certification forms may be obtained from local OSEA chapters or from Association headquarters. Forms must be sent to OSEA (1127 25th Street SE, Salem, Oregon, 97301) no later than March 1.

Financial aid applications are issued by the Oregon State Scholarship Commission (1445 Willamette Street, Suite 9, Eugene, Oregon, 97401). An application may be

obtained from the OSSC or from any high school or college in Oregon. The forms must be sent to the scholarship commission by March 1.

All entering freshmen must take the scholastic

aptitude test which will be given for the last time on February 2. Students already enrolled in college need not take the test. Details about the SAT test may be obtained from any high school.

OSEA makes two types of awards under the program -- scholarships and grants-in-aid. Both are awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement and financial need.

Scholastic achievement and potential is given more consideration in selecting scholarship recipients; financial need is more important in determining grant-in-aid recipients.

The monetary amount of both scholarships and grants-in-aid range from \$200 to \$400 a year, payable one-third each term or one-half each semester. The number and amount of the annual awards depends upon the total amount of the fund.

Recipients may attend any accredited institution of higher education, including private schools and out-of-state schools.

Responsibility for selecting recipients and determining whether the award will consist of a scholarship or grant-in-aid rests with the scholarship commission under guidelines set forth by OSEA.

## OSEA Student Aid Totals \$55,300

The Oregon State Employees Association has awarded \$55,300 in financial aid to Oregon students since beginning its scholarship and grant-in-aid program in 1958.

A total of 131 scholarships and 56 grants-in-aid has been awarded to 187 students seeking to continue their education. That amounts to an average of about \$295 per student.

The Association's scholarship program is financed by voluntary contributions from its 81 local chapters located throughout the state.
