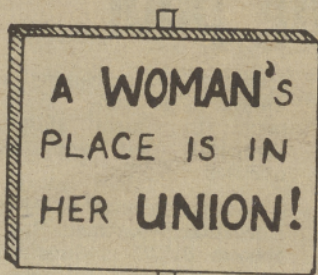

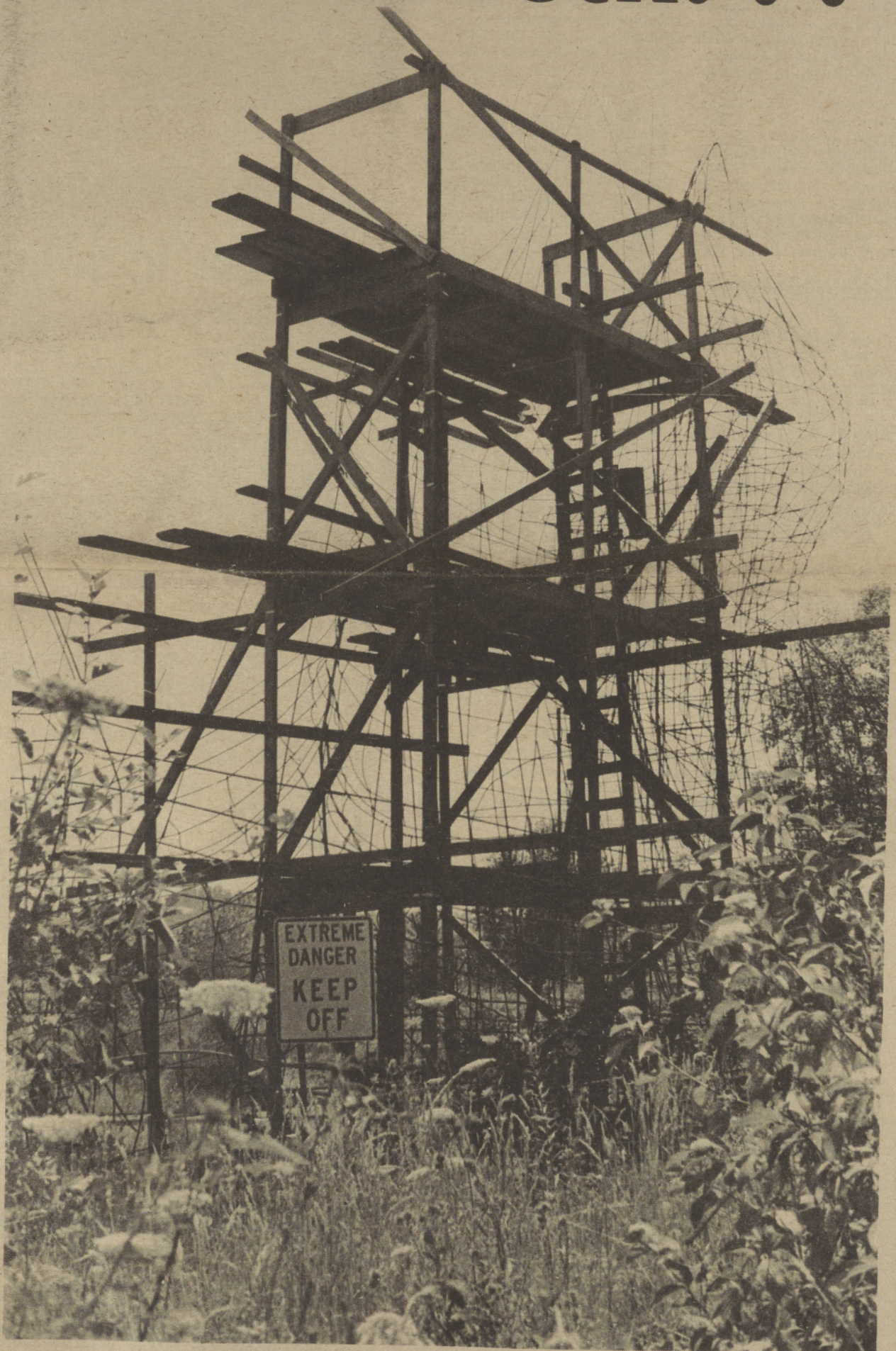
ABOUT THREE OSEA MEM-
