**Rules Governing Athletics.**

a. Each candidate for membership on an athletic team must have finished his preparatory work through to the eleventh grade. If a regular student, he must be carrying the amount of work prescribed by the Committee on Special Students. In either case he must maintain a standing of "C" or better in all of his subjects.

b. Any person who has participated, as a college student, in any intercollegiate game, as a member of an athletic team, in any other college, is ineligible to participate in any game as a member of an athletic team in this University until he shall have been a matriculant in this University for a period of one year.

To this regulation there are the following exceptions, and the following classes of students are eligible at once to membership on an athletic team:

1. A student who obtains a diploma of graduation before leaving his college.
2. A student who has been absent from college one continuous college year or more.
3. A student who has completed in the college which he leaves an amount of work not more than equivalent to the entrance requirements in some one of the academic or engineering courses of this University.

NOTE.—The requirements for admission to athletic teams will be advanced in accordance with the increased requirements for admission to the University.

**II.**

Each candidate for membership on an athletic team must maintain a student character above reproach to be eligible to membership or to maintain his position on a team.

**III.**

He must have during the preceding semester secured the mark of "C" or better in all his studies and he must maintain said standing in order to retain his membership on the team.

**IV.**

If the candidate has registered after the opening of the college year, he must have registered at least one month before taking part in any intercollegiate contest.

**V.**

No student shall play in any game under an assumed name.

**VI.**

No person shall be admitted to any intercollegiate contest who receives any gift, remuneration or pay for his services on the University team.

**VII.**

The list of all students to be selected

to represent the University in intercollegiate contests shall be submitted to the Athletic Committee for their approval.

The Committee shall require every person who desires to represent the University in intercollegiate contests to subscribe to a statement\* at the opening of his training season that he is eligible under the letter and spirit of the above rules, and such application, when endorsed by the chairman and secretary of the Committee on Athletics upon the authority of the Committee shall constitute his credentials as a member of the team.

**VIII.**

The coach must be of good moral character. He must be a college graduate or have college antecedents satisfactory to the Committee on Athletics, and must be approved by the Committee on Athletics before he is employed.

The football season shall close December 1.

The schedule of games shall be submitted to the Committee on Athletics for approval before any games are arranged for.

**IX.**

Each team shall be governed by a separate Board, consisting of Manager, Assistant Manager, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected subject to the approval of the Committee on Athletics.

Nominees for the different offices shall be referred to the Committee on Athletics.

**X.**

The Treasurers of the various Boards shall be required to give bonds for the faithful performance of their duties, the amount of the bonds to be fixed by the Committee on Athletics, and they shall present to the Committee on Athletics, at the close of each season, or upon demand, a report of all disbursements, with vouchers and itemized receipts for the same.
