

STUDENT BODY MEETING

Important Amendments Introduced Which Will be Voted on at Next Meeting

The student body held a business meeting last Monday morning at 11:50. The attendance was good, considering the nearness of the noon hour. The new officers were at their post of duty.

A committee was appointed to draft a set of resolutions which will be adopted at next meeting. Four important amendments to the constitution and by-laws were read for the first time. Two aim to secure an increase in the editorial staff of the Weekly and Monthly. The third amendment makes some important changes in the duties of the treasurer of the association and takes away his 3 percent salary. A meeting will be held this week to take final action on the proposed amendments.

The following is a copy of the amendments in the order they were read:

That Article 1, Section 3 of the By Laws referring to the Oregon Weekly be amended to read as follows:

Sec- 2.—The editorial staff of the paper shall consist of an Editor-in-chief and four Associate Editors, the Editor-in-chief and two Associate Editors to be chosen on the third Wednesday of May of each year in the same manner that the executive committee of this Association is elected, the remaining two associates to be appointed by the Editor-in-chief some time after the beginning of the school year next following his election. The business staff of this paper shall consist of a Business Manager and an assistant Business Manager, who shall be elected on the third Wednesday in May of each year in the same manner that the Executive committee of this association is elected.

This amendment shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Under the heading "The U. of O. Monthly" that Article II of the By Laws be amended to read:

The publication of this paper shall be in the hands of an Editor-in-chief, two Associate Editors, a Business Manager and Assistant Business Manager. Two additional Associate Editors may be appointed by the Editor-in-chief, the same to be confirmed by the Executive Committee of the Associated Students.

That Section 1, Article II, be amended to read:

The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, the President and Secretary to be elected from the Senior class, the Vice President and Treasurer from the Junior.

That Section 5, Article II, be amended to read as follows:

It shall be the duty of the Treas-

urer to receive all moneys accruing to the Association, collect all dues and assessments, pay all bills and warrants approved by the President and to keep an accurate account thereof and make a report of the same to the Executive Committee of the Associated Students on or before the 30th day of September, also to file a duplicate copy with the steward of the University at the same time.

Strike out Sections 6 and 7 of Article II and substitute therefor the following:

Sections 6 and 7—The Treasurer shall deposit all moneys accruing to the Association with the steward of the University. The amount thus deposited to be subject to warrants signed by the President and Treasurer of the Associated Students and countersigned by the steward of the University.

That in Section 1 of by-laws, the clause "Treasurer of Associated Students, 3 per cent," be stricken out and that the miscellaneous fund read "15 per cent" instead of "15" as at present.

That Section 8, Article II of the Constitution be stricken out and the following two sections be substituted:

1. No student who is a contestant in the local debating contest or the local oratorical contest and who, at the same time shall be a member of the Executive Committee, shall participate in the selection of judges for such contest.

2. The remaining members of the Executive Committee shall select some student from the Junior or Senior classes who shall cooperate with them in selection of judges; and in case the President and Vice President be contestants, the Executive Committee thus made up shall provide a chairman to take the place of the regular presiding officers at such local contests.

COLLEGE ASSOCIATION

The College Association made up of representatives of the principal colleges and secondary schools in Western Oregon, met in Portland Saturday, October 11th. The purpose of the meeting was to formulate a set of rules for the regulation of athletics. After some discussion, they adopted some nine or ten rules which they recommend to the colleges throughout the state for adoption. The object of the rules is to prevent any but bonafide students from taking part in games or contests, to bar professionalism and to provide a board of arbitration who shall adjust disputes, when a protest is entered by one of the schools.

One can not help but be impressed with the similarity of the rules adopted to those already in use at the University of Oregon.

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
