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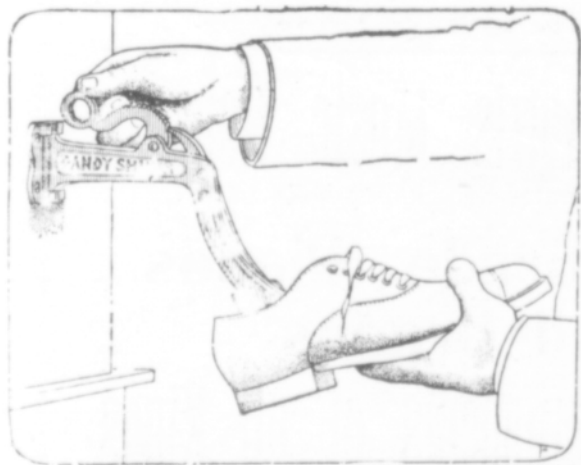
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OREGON WINS STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

NOTES ON SATURDAY'S GAME

The following statistics are accurate as far as possible, and will no doubt prove interesting to readers of The Weekly:

On line plunges O. A. C. made 35 yards more than did the University.

Oregon's end runs netted her 58 yards to Corvallis' 15.

Moullen, for Oregon, punted seven times, averaging 45 yards to the kick. Pilkington averaged 35 yards in five kicks. Moullen's best efforts in this live covered 60 yards, and his poorest 35 yards. Pilkington's longest punt was 45 yards, and his shortest 25.

The officials of the game showed coolness and impartiality. Their work was entirely satisfactory and elicited no animosity from the players.

Gordon Moore's sensational run of 35 yards was the longest of the day. Frank Templeton was next with 25.

Williams' spectacular hurdle over Seth Kerron near the close of the second half was a feature of the game.

Virgil Earl suffered a serious injury during the struggle when after playing a magnificent game, both offensive and defensive, he was forced to retire near the end of the second half. He received a severe blow on the head. Lawrence had his shoulder broken, and Pinkington's shoulder was injured.
