### 'VARSITY HITS BALL HARD

#### Defeats Columbia Athletic Club of The Dalles by Score of Ten to Two

The 'Varsity baseball team had things their own way in the game Saturday with the Columbia Athletic Club of The Dalles. The visitors played a good game but could not connect safely with the ball when a hit meant a run. On the other hand the Oregon players usually bunched their hits and earned their scores.

Harold Clifford, '09, formerly of Hill's Military Academy, was tried out in the box and pitched a splendid game. Seven hits were made off of his delivery, but some of them were scratchy. He made ten men trot back to the bench on account of the necessary three, hit one man, and issued no passes. McCoy made a long drive that looked like a home run, but the ball hit the center field fence a few inches from the top, and the big catcher did not get past the second sack. Captain McInery accepted twelve chances without making an error. Two quick double plays brought cheers from the grandstand.

Oregon got busy in the opening inning and hustled a man across the home base. With two men out Hathaway walked, stole second and third, and scored when Brown singled. The Dalles counted one in the second. McInery hit safely, and Rice brought him around with a two-base hit. The 'Varsity squeezed in two more in the third on hits by Ramp and Hathaway, a sacrifice, and an error by Conrow. In the fourth Hurd slammed one over third which took him half way around. Johnson and Clifford drove the ball through the same opening, and Hurd and Johnson registered, and Clifford

reached third. He scored a moment later on an out at first. The Dalles made their second run in the seventh on errors by Ramp and Hobbs, and a hit by Rice. Oregon added two counters in the seventh on an error, hits by Hathaway and Brown, and a passed ball. The scoring ended in the eighth. Hurd walked, but was forced out at second by Johnson. Clifford walked, and Ramp's hit scored Johnson. Paine hit a long fly to center, and Clifford beat the throw-in to the plate. The score:
