WILLIAM H. BALDWIN PRIZE

Topic, "The Relation of the Municipality to the Water Supply"

A prize of \$100 has been offered to promote the study of municipal problems among college students throughout the United States. The competition is under the direct supervision of the National Municipal League, of which Dr. Ward W. Pierson is acting chairman.

The work that is being done by this League, which was founded to promote the study of affairs that are of the greatest importance to the government of a city, is being watched with great satisfaction and interest.

The League now comprises eleven of the largest universities in the country, namely, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Chicago, Princeton, Harvard, Indiana, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Missouri, Texas, and Columbia, while many of the other universities are seriously considering the matter of joining in the work, Yale University having sent a representative to the meetings. Although the subject of practical economy deals with these affairs, still it deemed necessary that more attention and research work should be devoted to the study of problems that continually confront the government of a city. In connection with the work of the league an annual prize of \$100 is offered, to be awarded to the student, an undergraduate, registered in a regular course in any college or university of the United States offering distinct instruction in municipal government, who shall submit the best essay on a topic decided by the Executive Committee of the League.

The subject for 1906-07 is "The Relation of the Municipality to the Water Supply," the winner of which will be announced at the next meeting of the League. The gift, which is known as the William H. Baldwin Prize, was awarded last year to Arno Woods; a member of the Sophomore Class of the University of Illinois. The competition closes in March, 1907.
