PROFESSOR DUNN SPEAKS

To the Young Men's Christian Association on Friday Evening on "College Decorum"

"College Decorum" was the theme of Professor Dunn at Y. M. C. A. last Friday evening. Every man in the University should have heard this helpful talk. Prof. Dunn said in part:

"The report gains credence in some parts of the state that ours is a Godless College. Good reports are also heard everywhere of the work and influence of the Y. M. C. A. This should spur men to exert themselves more actively in Christian work.

"Contact with people from various places in Oregon shows that some have the mistaken idea that the University is a place of loose morals and rather free living. These erroneous notions should be rectified by individual effort on the part of members of the student body to maintain, and where possible to raise, our standards. Let students be moderate in their amusements. When groups of football, glee club, baseball, basketball or track men are traveling, their conduct should be above question. As members of a co-educational institution, the students should be especially careful to conduct themselves with due propriety."

Prof. Dunn was the first president of the University Association, and is still interested in its work. He is always a welcome speaker.

At the recent tryout for intercollegiate debaters Walter M. Eaton was given the position of second colleague on the negative team which debates the University of Washington at Seattle, and Thos. R. Townsend was placed as first colleague on the affirmative team which meets Idaho at Eugene. In the tryout Eaton and Townsend took sides opposite to that on which they were placed in the final tryout. Both men are very busy and having little time to prepare on the side opposite from which they tried out, the two men have, by consent of the judges, traded positions. Eaton now becomes a member of the affirmative trio and Townsend of the negative.
