The Significance of the Grail Community and the Grail.

The Grail Community in "Parsifal"—of which every member is a knight and not only a declared supporter of the Grail but a man who has submitted himself to severe inward testings that make him worthily eligible for membership—is Wagner's conception of the ideal church. It is in every sense spiritual, in none material. Its power, duty, responsibility and consciousness are all different expressions of the same word. Its functions are to serve mankind by the exercise of that sublime sense of duty, or generosity, which in every transaction of our daily intercourse enables one to concede to the other that difference which makes him superior morally.

The ideal state or community, wherein is exercised the moral quality of conceding grace, the noblesse which always must serve before it is noblesse, is Wagner's Grail. Between its members there is no relationship that gives rise to the exercise of grace, but, between them and the mysterious source of all grace, there is the symbolic act of the uncovering of the Grail by its head or king.

The Grail temple, as it will be represented on the stage of the Eugene Theatre, Saturday, February 15th, is a noble and beautiful scenic masterpiece. Managers Martin and Emery have succeeded in creating a perfect replica of the sacred edifice as shown at the Baireuth festivals. The scene in the temple, in the final act, where Parsifal heals the wounded King by a touch of the Sacred Spear and holds aloft the holy vessel, from which flows hope and renewed spiritual vigor, forms a most solemn and impressive stage spectacle.

Parsifal patrons should bear in mind the unusual hour of commencement. The first curtain will rise at 7:45 sharp.
