The meeting February 18 was in charge of Miss Green, chairman of the Missionary committee. It was one of the best meetings of the year. We had with us Miss Hanna of the class of '96, one of the charter members of the Association, and now home on a vacation from her missionary work among the Alaskans.

An inspiring address was given by Miss Julia Fraser, a prominent home missionary worker of the Presbyterian church. Miss Fraser was one of the speakers at the Y. W. C. A. convention in Corvallis last spring and the girls who heard her there were very glad indeed of the chance of meeting her once more. For the past year she has been working among the Mormons in Utah, gaining firsthand knowledge of their doctrines and customs. She said that the Mormonism displayed in Salt Lake City is not Mormonism proper, but only the better side of it, polished and dressed up as attractively as possible, to disarm the suspicious and averse anticipations of tourists, sightseers, and the general public. In order to see Mormonism as it really is, and as it is practiced, one must leave the public gatherings and public sermons and lectures and investigate the temple service to which no one but a Mormon is ever admitted, or go to the out-of-the-way villages and districts, remote from public inspection and criticism, for it is in such places as these, that true Mormonism exists.

In closing, she urged the girls to pledge themselves to the integrity, the honor, and the spiritual welfare of our nation, and to use all their influence against those doctrines, customs, and so-called religions which are a disgrace to any civilized nation.
