He said that God has a plan for every life, and only as we recognize and meet his claim upon us, are our lives successful. Thus do we attain the largest success and happiness.

He gave as the three essentials for success in life, (1) the power to discern between right and wrong; (2) the desire to do the right, and (3) the love of the right, that we may desire to do it. He told what President Roosevelt once said to him. That if right and wrong were a matter of black and white, at would not be hard to distinguish between them, and thus contrasted, one would naturally prefer and choose the right. But as it is right and wrong are so blended and inter-mixed that they form often indistinguishable shades of gray and so it is a difficult matter to segregate the right and to act in accordance with the very best.

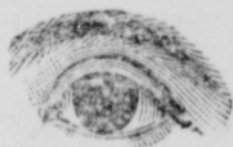
