inexpedient, but also impracticable and unnecessary. "The only way," he stated, "to restrict Japanese immigration is to restrict it at its source, to stop it in Japan," and he showed that Japan had already begun such a policy.

J. H. Bond made a five-minute rebuttal in which he made a strong attack upon the whole negative argument. Mr. Bond's rebuttal closed the debate, after which the judges submitted their decision which was two to one in favor of the negative. The judges were Judge Otto Kramer of Portland; President Crooks, of Albany College, and Professor Prideaux, of Willamette University.

The Idaho debaters were all strong, forceful speakers, with convincing constructive arguments, and while the Oregon men made determined assaults in refutation, the decision was a just and well-merited one.

Before the debate, Miss Irene Simington rendered a very pleasing vocal solo.
