**Laurean Society**

Last Saturday evening's meeting of the Laurean Literary Society was the event of the society's first semi-public debate of the year.

Preceding the debate Prof. F. G. Young addressed the society upon the subject "The Here and The Now." In his remarks, Prof. Young spoke at length upon the present political situation, both national and state. He dwelt upon the issues involved in the coming presidential campaign, the general significance of these issues and the part of the voter in considering them at present and in the future. He emphasized the importance of the voters exerting an actual and wholesome influence in all political affairs.

The address was highly interesting and instructive and much appreciated by all present.

The debate followed upon the question; Resolved, That a constitutional amendment should be passed giving congress exclusive power over marriages and divorces, the difficulties of passing the amendment not entering the discussion.

The speakers supporting the negative were, Ben Williams, closer; Ted Smith and Wm. Rueter, colleagues. For the affirmative, Clarence Steele was closer with Leland Steiwer as colleague. Oliver Houston, who intended to participate, was called away by a telegram.

The decision of the judges was rendered in favor of the negative.
