Y. M. C. A.

"Expansion" was the topic discussed at the regular association meeting of the Y. M. C. A. by T. R. Townsend. Mr. Townsend graphically portrayed the stages of growth by which the membership of the association has increased from nineteen in 1892 to one hundred and twenty-two in 1908. He showed in some detail how the Y. M. C. A., at first not a considerable factor in the life of the University, has grown to be its most representative body. He showed the need for workers which has come with the increased membership and activity of the association, and urged his hearers to throw themselves into avenues of unselfish effort along the lines of Y. M. C. A. work.

"The mark for the membership committee next year," said the speaker, "is fifty per cent of the men in college. Our rapid and healthful growth in the past is due to the fact that the association has at all times maintained a high standard. This standard, if we wish to increase our membership, must not only be maintained, but raised. The only way to raise the standard of the aggregate is for the individual member to raise his individual standard. Let us watch and improve ourselves."
