The regular meeting took place on Tuesday evening in Deady Hall. Miss Balderee, president of the society, led the meeting which proved to be helpful as well as interesting to the large number of young women present. The topic, "The Student Volunteer Movement," was outlined by the leader. She told of its beginning on the banks of the Connecticut river, twenty years ago, at a conference where one hundred volunteers were registered from college circles. Since then, over three thousand students, one third young women, have been dedicated to the work. Word was read from Mrs. Ennis, formerly Miss Logan, who is on the field in Benguela, where she finds pleasant work among the natives.

Miss Essie Secrist read a short paper on Medical Missions, which she showed to be the forerunner of Christianity in foreign lands.

This work is crippled for want of equipment, and for lack as well of women physicians, who can reach the foreign women as can no other missionary.

Miss Watson spoke entertainingly of the need of teachers of English, domestic science and physical culture.

Miss Wilbur's clear and beautiful soprano voice was much appreciated in her solo.

Plans for the annual Y. M. C. A. convention at The Breakers are now being formed. The local committee is anxious to give every association member the opportunity of attending this conference if he so desires. Several of the men who attended last year will go again, while a number of new men are also expected to avail themselves of the privilege.

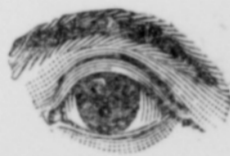
