Tuesday, Miss Jessie Calkins led the meeting. Miss Shafer gave a soprano solo and after the regular devotional, Miss Eva Marie Leind, deaconess of the Methodist church of this city, read an illuminating paper on "Christian Work in the Cities."

Miss Leind reviewed the situation prevalent in all our American cities in regard to the illiteracy of the voters, either foreigners or unlearned Americans; the over-crowded tenements; the insufficient advantages in the way of schools, homes, churches and fresh air, and showed how these wants were being helped by the growing organization of Settlements, Nurseries, Rescues, Guilds, Aid Societies and Christian Associations. Further interesting details were given and at the close of the paper, Miss Leind read Mrs. Myer's beautiful poem, "The Burden."
