### Light on Oregon Question

Professor Joseph Shafer has, in the current number of the American Historical Review, copies of a number of valuable documents bearing on the Oregon question of 1841 to 1843.

These are in the form of letters written by Sir George Simpson, agent of the Hudson's Bay Company, while paying official visits to the Pacific Coast. They describe minutely conditions at the military stations and give a thoroughly good idea of the resources of the country as they were then known.

"Doubtless these letters were," as Professor Shafer says, "the cause of the renewed interest in the settlement of the Oregon question and the political destiny of California."

Copies of these and other valuable papers relating to the history of the Northwest were made from the original documents preserved in the Public Record Office in London, by Professor Shafer during his recent trip abroad, and are now on file in the library at the University.

### Debate Bulletin

Proof sheets of the bulletin to be issued soon by Prof. E. E. DeCou on the "High School Debate League" show that the bulletin will be of interest and value. A list of the officers of the league is given at the first of the volume, followed by a copy of the constitution. Cuts of the championship team, Lebanon, and its closest rivals, Grants Pass, Astoria and Baker City, will illustrate the pamphlet. President Marlatte, of the league, contributes an article on "Debate Coaches and Debate Credit." Many new schools have entered the league this year.
