FARMER ARTIST ENTERTAINS

Montgomery Delighted Large Audi-
ence of Students at Assembly
Last Wednesday Morning

Mr. Montgomery, "the farmer paint-
er," was interesting in Assembly Wed-
nesday morning. He is a firm believer
in American art, the art that portrays
the life of our nation and especially
of the great West. His address was
quaint and full of sound sense tempered
by the peculiarly fascinating individ-
uality of the artist.

"Art is indefinable and incomprehen-
sible," he said, "and nowhere can be
found the man or group of men worthy
to pass judgment upon it. When I
build my new house, it is to contain a
gallery where American artists may
hang their work without subjecting it
to the criticism of a bunch of 'sapheads.'
Art is helpful, hopeful, homely and
beautiful. Like life, it is Argus-eyed,
all sided; like life it is in all things re-
lative. Our present American art is
daring, but it is art. It shows forth
the spirit of '76. 'Art is the very na-
ture of man.' Whatever pertains to
manners and morals is art, be it paint-
ing, politics or theology. The mea-
sure of achievement in art is faith.
Faith is the greatest thing in the
world. We can do whatever we want
to do. To mind genius means motive.
The world has been looking at the
word through the wrong end of the
telescope. There have been a few gen-
iuses in history. And it is a com-
fort to me to know that they have
all been brought up in Nazareth. My
message is to the unpromising ones.
For nine years I was a bound boy in
Illinois. One of my most successful
pictures is of the old woodshed where
I had many painful experiences. I
clipped the family cat before I heard
of Benjamin West.

"Character must enter into every-
thing. Art is the crowning effort of
character. No prurient glory seeker
can win, but all must be done in the
spirit of the Master. I am an opti-
mist, one who sees the hills behind
the hills. The world is just as good
as it can be and is getting better all
the time."
