OREGON DEFEATS IDAHO--SCORE: 27 TO 21

Score at the End of the First Half in Favor of Idaho Changed Into Victory by Pluck of Oregon's Defenders

Moullen and Clarke saved and won the day for Oregon at Moscow on Saturday. Four place kicks, by Captain Moullen, three of them in the second half on fair catches, a touchdown by Clarke and another by Kiltz made up the Oregon score. Idaho scored a touchdown in the second minute of play, and made two touchdowns and a place kick in the second half. Clarke had all the honors in the punting. Idaho's fancy plays did not work at all. Coach Forbes, whose system of coaching has been amply justified by success in the most doubtful game of the season, used seventeen men, nine of whom won their emblems. They are Dodson, Michael, Sweek, Means, Kiltz, Hayes, McKinley, Chandler and Latourette. When Main was ruled off the field for roughness early in the second half, Oregon had to finish the game with only ten men. Small starred for Idaho. Savidge, Idaho's great end, was outplayed by Michael.

Story of the Game.

The game was called at one-thirty. Idaho kicked off. Clarke caught the ball and made a good return before being tackled. Oregon punted on the first down. Idaho returned the punt. Chandler then called the signal for a forward pass, which was fumbled, Idaho recovering the ball and carrying it over the goal line, a distance of some twenty-five yards. Goal was kicked. Score: Idaho, 4; Oregon, 0, after two minutes of play.

A punting duel occupied most of the remainder of the half. In this contest, Clarke had so much the better of the argument that Oregon was brought within striking distance of the Idaho goal, and Moullen made a kick from placement on the forty-five yard line. Neither side made yardage often in this half, but relied upon kicking. Score at the end of the first half: Idaho, 6; Oregon, 4.

The Second Half.

Oregon kicked to Idaho. The ball was carried back about twenty yards. Idaho lost the ball and Moullen kicked from placement on the forty-yard

line. An interchange of punts resulted in a fair catch, which Moullen converted into a goal: Idaho, 6; Oregon, 12.

When the ball was again put in play, Idaho, by a skillful and successful use of the forward pass, got within striking distance of Oregon's goal, and Small executed a place kick, bringing Idaho's end of the score up to 10. Once more the battle of the giant full-backs was on. An Idaho man fumbled a return punt, and the nimble Kiltz snatched the ball and sped through a scattered field for a touchdown. Clarke kicked goal. Score: Idaho, 10; Oregon 18.

Idaho attempted to vary the punting game by a trick play. One of the

ends stole out to the side lines and lay there awaiting a forward pass, but Michael and Clarke were too wary to be caught napping and ran to intercept the pass. Clarke caught it and got clear for a touchdown. Goal was missed. Idaho, 10; Oregon, 23.

At this point Main, who was angered by being illegally held by his opponent in the line, was guilty of slugging, and was ruled off the field, leaving Oregon only ten men. As an additional penalty, Oregon was set back half the length of the field. Idaho profited by the advantage and put the ball over the line on straight football. One more difficult place kick finished the scoring for Oregon. Score: Idaho, 16; Oregon, 27.

Clarke caught a punt and attempted a forward pass, which was intercepted

by Lundstrom, who ran for a touchdown. The officials allowed the score, although they admitted later that according to the rules, Oregon should have been penalized and the score disallowed. Final score: Idaho, 21; Oregon, 27.
