New Cataloguer Employed

In order to take care of the new books and arrange them systematically in the library the University has engaged Miss Beatrice J. Barker, a cataloguer of the library of the University of California. Miss Barker has excellent recommendations. She is a graduate of Brown University and the Albany Library School, Albany New York. She has had experience in the library of Brown University, the New York State Library, the public library of Springfield, Massachusetts, and the library of the University of California. The University authorities think themselves fortunate to obtain a cataloguer of such wide experience. Miss Brown will arrive to begin her work about the first of January. Until that time the books that are coming in will be accessioned and labeled and put in shape for use, but will not be actually catalogued.

Recently a new lot of books of about five hundred and fifty volumes have arrived, covering the departments of American History, European History, Economics, Sociology, Modern English Literature, Ethics, and Mathematics. Besides these, orders have been placed for about one thousand dollars worth of French, German, and Italian books which will probably arrive before the first of January.
