### Lectures on Comparative Religion

To those who are interested in the study of religious questions it will be a pleasure to learn that Dr. Jean du Buy is giving weekly lectures upon comparative religion at his home at 130 East Eleventh Street, to which students are cordially invited. Dr. du Buy has made a long and thorough study of the different religions of the world and has lectured for three years at Clarke University upon Comparative Religion. It is his purpose in these lectures to make a scientific examination of the great religions of the world to find the characteristics of each, to what types of mind each is fitted, and to compare them for the traits that are common to all. So far the doctor has discussed the religion of ancient Egypt and Confucianism. In the future he will consider the following religions:

Brahmanism, an old religion of India; the religion of ancient Israel; Christianity; Stoicism; Buddhism; Taoism, the second native religion of China; the Vedanta philosophy or the philosophy of Brahmanism; Hindooism; Christian Science.

Although the time for the lectures is not definitely fixed, the students are, for the present, meeting at the home of Dr. du Buy on Wednesday evenings at seven o'clock.
