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Speaker Tells of Livingstone

Livingstone was the subject of an address by H. I. Sutton of the Bible University at the Y. M. C. A. last Friday night. He said in part, "Livingstone was born in 1813 in Scotland. He was merely an ordinary boy with ordinary talents and would have made only an ordinary man had not he been inspired with a great motive. He was born at the time when the mission movement was just beginning and great enthusiasm was being shown for the work. On hearing an address by Dr. Moffet who had just returned from Africa he became possessed of a determination to go to that continent. His work there has made him a great man in history. He opened up the dark continent to civilization and to Christianity. His courage in facing the dangers, fevers, and hardships of the jungle was sublime; and when he died England buried him among her great est sons in Westminster Abbey. The speaker closed with an earnest appeal for work in the mission field on the part of the Christian men of the University.

Books Still Come

New books which have lately arrived at the library are 25 volumes of Spanish books, 16 volumes of Italian books, 25 volumes on Political Science, 26 volumes of Appleton's Annual Encyclopedia, which is an Encyclopedia published at the end of each year summarizing the events of that year, Hastings' 5 volume Dictionary of the Bible, a number of volumes of the transactions of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers and an Engineering index, indexing the technical literature of the world.

120 new shelves have been put up in the basement of the library in order to make room for Dr. Sheldon's collection of documents on educational subjects.
