

Fire At Tutalip.

Supr. Foster has just received a letter from Mr. Harris agency clerk, stating that Dr. Buchanan's residence was burned on Tuesday night January 21st. We greatly regret that Dr. and Mrs. Buchanan should meet with such a great financial loss, just as they had started out in their new line of work. We copy the letter:

The residence of Dr. Charles M. Buchanan, Superintendent and U. S. Indian Agent, was entirely destroyed last night about 11:30 o'clock, together with its entire contents except the piano and a few pieces of paper. Dr. and Mrs. Buchanan were in Seattle to attend the funeral of Dr. H. D. Kline, leaving Mrs. Leta M. Buchanan's mother, and Louise Buchanan the only occupants of the house. The cause of the fire is an entire mystery, as both Mrs. Lee and Louise say that there was no fire whatever in the house when they returned only a short time before the flames burst forth. They barely had time to get out with their fives and a very few pieces of clothing. By an extra effort on the part of Agency and School employes the neighboring buildings were saved, so that no official records or valuable papers were destroyed.
