Athletics.

The Indians defeated Dickinson on our field in track and field sports last Saturday, scoring 73 points to Dickinson 31. Carlson secured first place in every event except the 100 and 220 yard dashes and showed up very strong.

Frank M. Pleasant broke Carlisle's record of 55 seconds in the 400 yard dash which was formerly held by Charles Cusick. Mr. Pleasant's time being 54 seconds.

John Walejal made new records in the hammer and shot, increasing Woodcock's record in the hammer throw of 107 feet 2 inches to 112 feet 10 inches and Phillip's record 26 feet 11 inches in the shot put to 27 feet 6 inches.

One of the best performances of the day was Hummeltgard's win in the one mile race. His time of 4 minutes 43 4/5 seconds, shows that he is in the first class in long distance running.

While Charles showed up strong in the high and broad jumps, and Antell's win of the half mile run was a very plucky and creditable performance.—[The Red Man and Helper.
