



THE ENGINE ROOM.

We don't if there is an Indian school in the service where a young man has a better chance to learn steam and electrical engineering than at Chemawa.

We generate our own power and heat and light our buildings.

It requires two sixty and one eighty horse power boilers to do the work. There are two dynamos of 25 and 30 Kw. capacity and two 8 horse power motors.

The engineers see to the heating and lighting of our buildings, pump our water, supply steam for cooking and electric power for the laundry, shops and wood saws.

Young men get a thorough course in steam fitting and electric construction in addition to plumbing and engineering, and can complete their course in three years.
