



ROOT HOUSE.

The root house, to store our potatoes, onions and garden vegetables has been completed and is now full of what to an Indian school means good living.

This building is 120 ft. long and 30 ft. wide and was constructed by the carpenter apprentices under the supervision of Mr. G. S. Hills.

In the construction of buildings of this kind Chermaw's apprentices get an opportunity that is of great value to them.

The building now contains over a thousand sacks of onions and more than 2000 bushels of potatoes in addition to other vegetables.

The onion house is in one end and supplied with racks to properly house them while the main room is supplied with commodious bins for the balance of the vegetables.
