



## The Industrial Trades Building.

BUILT IN 1902.

Chemawa's new brick Industrial Trades building, was erected at a cost of \$40,000. In it are comfortably housed, the tailors and dressmakers, the harnessmakers, the shoemakers, the wagonmakers and the carpenters. Just beyond is the house, which is the engineers' and plumbers' department. The blacksmiths, bakers, printers and painters are in other buildings. The building is steam heated, electric lighted and provided with water and toilet on both floors.

To the above mentioned trades, Chemawa offers young Indian men exceptional advantages and instruction in farming, dairying, gardening and experience as orchardists.
