I suppose you will be shocked to hear about the great disaster down south in the state of California, which destroyed the city of San Francisco.

I think you have heard about these terrible days in San Francisco, wasn't that too bad for those getting killed by the fire and the buildings falling on them. Now they have nothing to ent. People from Portland and different places are sending food there. They have no water to drink.
