

Thanksgiving Day at Chemawa.

Thanksgiving Day, 1906, passed off pleasantly at Chemawa. It was an ideal one. At ten o'clock the student body and employes assembled in the school chapel which had been tastily decorated by a committee of teachers. The address of Mr. Weber was well adapted for the occasion. He was attentively listened to by the student body and many favorable comments were made by his hearers.

The next on the program was dinner at twelve o'clock. The dining room had been neatly and appropriately decorated and the tables groaned with good things to eat, which were dispatched in good order after the benediction, which Mr. Winan suggested should be sung "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow." At each plate was placed a neatly printed menu. The first page contained the President's Proclamation, the second, a front view of Chemawa's Dining Room and then the Menu and the Program of the day.
