M., Saturday June 8, 1907, inviting proposals for furnishings and delivering at the school, as required during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1908, about twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds of fish, as per specifications obtainable at the school. Bidders must state in their bid the price of the fish per pound. The fish, when delivered, shall be subject to rigid inspection. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids or any part of any bid if deemed for the best interests of the service. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or draft on some United States depository or solvent national bank, made payable to the order of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, for at least five per cent. of the bid, which check or draft shall be forfeited to the United States in case a bidder receiving an award shall fail to execute promptly a satisfactory contract in accordance with his proposal; otherwise to be returned to the bidder.
