SUPPER—Pork and beans; Beets with butter or dripping; Bread; Gravy; Apple sauce (dried); Tea.

TUESDAY. BREAKFAST—Mush; Fried potatoes; Bread; Gravy; Syrup; Coffee.

DINNER—Pot pie (meat); Potatoes roasted with drippings in roaster; Rutabagas mashed seasoned with milk, etc; Bread; Milk.

SUPPER—Steamed potatoes without jackets; Gravy or butter; Prune sauce (dried); Bread; Tea.

WEDNESDAY. BREAKFAST—Mush; Steamed potatoes; Bread; Gravy; Prune butter; Coffee.

DINNER—Mutton fricassee on toast or with dumplings; Mashed potatoes; Cabbage salad; Bread; Milk.

SUPPER—Baked beans; Creamed carrots; Bread; Gravy; Peach sauce (dried); Tea.

THURSDAY. BREAKFAST—Mush; Fried potatoes; Bread; Gravy; Syrup; Coffee.

DINNER—Soup; Steak with gravy;

Steamed potatoes without jackets; Cabbage boiled with salt pork; Bread; Milk.

SUPPER—Rutabagas mashed; Bread; Gravy; Beets; Roly-poly; Tea.

FRIDAY. BREAKFAST—Mush; Steamed potatoes; Bread; Gravy; Prune butter; Coffee.

DINNER—Fish with milk gravy; Mashed potatoes; Cabbage salad; Bread; Milk.

SUPPER—Pork and beans; Pickled beets; Bread; Gravy; Canned fruit; Tea.

SATURDAY. BREAKFAST—Mush; Fried potatoes; Bread; Gravy; Prune sauce; Coffee.

DINNER—Roast beef with brown gravy; Steamed potatoes without jackets; Creamed cabbage; Bread; Milk.

SUPPER—Steamed potatoes without jackets or fried pumpkin; Bread; Gravy; Prune sauce (dried); Tea.
