### CHEMAWA BEATS PACIFIC

**Indians Score Four Touchdowns and Collegians One Drop-Kick.**

PACIFIC UNIVERSITY, Forest Grove, Or., Nov. 13.—(Special.)—Chemawa Indian Training School won the state championship of the non-conference colleges here today by defeating Pacific University with a 20 to 4 score. The local team had the better of the argument during the first half, which ended 4 to 0 in its favor, but went to pieces in the latter part of the game and allowed the Indians to make four touchdowns, no goals being kicked.

Chemawa kicked off, Pacific advancing the ball to the 20-yard line, then by a series of end runs and onside kicks P. U. carried the ball to the Indians' 25-yard line without a break, where Captain,
