Our Trip to Forest Grove.

Two weeks ago today ten young ladies chaperoned by Mrs. Chalcraft, Mrs. Brewer and Miss Bender, and twenty-three young men, Supt. Chalcraft, Mr. Bowen and Mr. Fleming accompanied the football team to Forest Grove. A special car was chartered from the Oregon Electric to carry the party.

The superstitious people say that Friday, the thirteenth of the month, is an unlucky day. Only a few of the party realized that the day was Friday until the trolley came down, smashing the heavy plate glass at the rear of the car. This caused considerable excitement. It was thought that the hoodoo was surely along. From that point everything ran along smoothly until we changed cars at Garden Home for Hillsboro. On this route the road is not in the best of condition and several times it seemed as if the car would leave the track. The continual rocking and bounding, and the disfigured appearance of the car caused much worry among the suspicious ones of the party. The football players called it "bumping the bumps."

Hillsboro was reached safely. After waiting there a short time, the S.P. train

was boarded for Forest Grove. The road was smooth, but the interior of the cars received all the smoke and cinders from the locomotive, causing several cases of headache, and soiled gowns, along with the bumps and seasickness which resulted from the jolting of the rough road. Nevertheless, Forest Grove was reached without disaster.

A trolley car at the depot carried us a distance of one mile to the hotel, where preparations were made to feed the hungry crowd. Mr. Marsh, Professor at the College, was there to meet the boys. He took us to the place where the Indian Training School (Now Chemawa) was established. The old buildings have all been torn down and large trees have grown up where some of them stood.

Prof. Marsh gave a portion of the grounds to the institution and took a great deal of interest in the work of educating the Indian boys and girls. He invited us to his library and gave us a lot of information which was much appreciated. He wished us success in every undertaking, with the exception of winning the football game.
