Breakfast—Oatmeal and milk, meat croquettes, bread and butter, plum sauce, doughnuts, coffee cake and coffee.

Dinner—Chicken (fried), gravy, mashed potatoes, fried parsnips, dressing, Chili sauce, cheese, bread and butter, celery, cranberries, pickles (sweet and sour), apples, coffee or water, mince and pumpkin pies.

Supper—Sandwiches, meat, eggs, pickles, potato salad, bread and butter, Parker House rolls, pear sauce, cookies and "rocks."
