CHEMAWA'S TWENTY-NINTH ANNIVERSARY.

Chemawa enters upon the 30th year of its existence under the most auspicious circumstances; with larger attendance than ever in its history; with more than a full school, having now on the grounds more than six hundred pupils; with the largest graduating class in its history; with a loyal student body, and with well equipped buildings and plant.

On this page is given a cut of the plant as it existed in 1880. Upon the frontis-piece is a partial view of the school as it is today. Major Wilkinson, the founder of Chemawa, certainly would be proud of the result of his efforts which started at Forest Grove, February 25, 1880. While General Pratt was starting Carlisle school on the Atlantic Coast, Major Wilkinson established Chemawa almost simultaneously.

As has been the custom for years the anniversary was celebrated and in a formal manner. Last evening the em-

ployees and student body assembled in the school chapel and talked about dear old Chemawa. As we go press too soon to give a full account of this meeting, we will have something to say concerning the same next week.
