

## FINAL TRY-OUT.

The final try-out for the ten best men to represent the school in the Salem-Portland relay race was held last Monday evening. There were twenty-one boys on the scratch to start. The distance of five miles was run and pretty good time was made, the whole ten not being more than a minute and a half apart, from first to last. This team promises to make a better showing than either of the two teams we entered before.
