**A Figure Puzzle:** Open a book at random, and select a word within the first ten lines, and within the tenth word from the end of the line. Mark the word. Now double the number of the page and multiply the sum by five. Then add twenty; then add the number of the line you have selected; then add five; multiply by ten; add the number of the word in the line; from this sum subtract 250, and the remainder will indicate in the units column the number of the word, in the tens column the number of the line, and the remaining figure the number of the page.

**How to Kill the Nerve of a Hollow Tooth:** Take half dram white oxide of arsenic, one dram of sulphate of morphia, mix with a little creosote and apply to the cavity of the tooth previously cleaned.

Procure a bunch of smartweed and bruise it to cause the juice to exude. Rub your horse or cow thoroughly with the bunch of bruisedweed, especially on the legs, neck and ears. Neither flies nor other insects will trouble it for 24 hours. This process should be repeated every day. A convenient way to use it is to make a strong infusion by boiling the weed a few minutes in water, when cold it can conveniently be applied with a sponge or a brush.

A bad breath or foul breath will be removed by taking a teaspoonful of the following, after each meal: One ounce liquors of potassa, one ounce chloride of soda, one and one-half ounces phosphate of soda and three ounces of water.—Frye.
