

MANY CURIOS.

The following dispatch from Clatskanie, Oregon, which recently appeared in the Oregon Journal, beyond doubt is of great interest:

T. M. Kelso, the Clatskanie photographer, has on display one of the finest collections of Indian relics and curios to be found in the Northwest. Mr. Kelso has spent 30 years in gathering up this collection and its value is about \$3,000.

In the exhibit, which has been collected from nearly every state in the union, are 2,600 arrow and spear points, knives, drills, reamers, scrapers, celts or hatchets, axes, war clubs and tomahawks, cleavers, mortars and pestles, paint bowls, pipes, beads, etc., canoe anchors, net and line sinkers, hammers, gorgets; curios, such as a steel point in fragment of buffalo's backbone; stone carved in imitation of papoose strapped to board, supposed to have been a god; mound builder's pipe with faces carved on two sides, etc. The collection also embraces 200 large stone relics, which are stored and not shown from lack of space.
