

CHEMAWA 10—DALLAS 36

On Friday evening the schedule called the Dallas College five to our floor. We were defeated, but defeat is no disgrace when received from such a strong and noted team as that from the Dallas institution.

In the first half we were entirely out-classed, the score at the end of it standing 29 to 4. This half was full of spectacular passing and accurate basket-shooting by the Dallas team, although our boys showed great strength in taking the ball from their opponents and carrying it toward our basket. But when they did get within shooting distance of the goal, the throws were not accurate and the ball was down to the opponents basket and through the net in quick order. The number of fair chances at goal missed by our boys, as counted by a reporter numbered 22, while Dallas missed but 5. With this good showing in team work, the basket-hitting branch should be practiced more hereafter.

The second half started with both teams fighting their best. This half was about even as the score shows, we being out-classed only in the basket hitting branch as usual. Our boys played rings around the Dallas men at times and showed superiority in handling passes. Clements frequently took the ball from one end to the other by dribbling and had the Dallas men completely bewildered. The score of this half was 7 to 6 in favor of Dallas, but this was also the result of their ability at basket shooting and not the team work.

All of the Chemawa men in this with the exceptions of Powers and Clements, were inexperienced, but played a good game. Walker and Lynch played at

guard during the first ten minutes of the first half and great credit is due them for putting the Dallas forwards into such a fatigued state that Mose and Talbot, who replaced them had little trouble with the tired men.

Fouls were not so plentiful as they were in the McMinville game and that shows a great improvement.
