

FINE LECTURE.

On Tuesday evening the entire student body assembled in the chapel and listened to a very instructive and interesting address by the Hon. Wilson R. Gill, President of the Patriotic League and founder of the "School City." Supervisor Gill is a very fluent speaker and made a good impression on the audience. He explained very fully the necessity of Civic Training for the American and brought out many points of interest to all future citizens—credits and discredits to citizens and gave his views on the systems of teaching citizenship.

At nine o'clock the lecture closed until the following morning when all again assembled and voted for the state officers. In order to teach the young American citizenship, Mr. Gill says that he must have early training in a simplified manner and so he has made the school a state and each class room a town or city. Each has its officers and each citizen and officer of state and city has a badge on which the proper inscription is printed. The state officers are as follows; Governor, Henry Darnell; Chief Justice, Eugene Anderson; Lieutenant-Governor, Minerva Meacum; Secretary of State, Lee Evans. These officers are banded together and will run the state of Chemawa to the best of their ability. Each classroom city has a name and its officers, and real business will soon begin as a Judge and Sheriff are among the city officers.

This system has been taken up by the Indian office and inaugurated in the various government schools. It has proved very effective in many of our city schools where the system has been established. From the Tulalip Indian School, Tulalip, Wash., Dr. Chas. M. Buchanan, superintendent, comes a splen-

did report of the system. We are to adopt the system and will watch with interest the work of our students in dealing with the problems which will confront them in their school affairs. We are glad to see them given an opportunity to prove their mettle, and also to report that they are taking hold of the proposition in a business-like manner.
