**A. M. REEVES DEAR; WAS FIONEER LINN COUNTY MERCHANT**  
 A. M. Reeves, a well known merchant of Lebanon and well known throughout Linn county, died at his home in Lebanon at a late hour yesterday afternoon, according to a message received by Albany fourth today. Owing to health conditions in Lebanon the funeral services will be held at the grave in the Masonic cemetery there Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock.  
 Mr. Reeves was born in Yamhill county in 1861 and had spent all his life in this state. He was a graduate of Willamette University at Salem, and taught school in this county for 12 years, serving as principal of the Halsey schools for several years.  
 There he was also postmaster and in the mercantile business following the end of his school work.  
 From Halsey he came to Albany and engaged in the mercantile business, moving later to Lebanon where he has since been engaged in the same business. He was the senior member of the firm of Reeves and Clark department store.  
 Mr. Reeves was formerly vice president of the merchants' retail association of the State, mayor of Lebanon, and at the time of his death was vice president of one of the banks of his home town. He was also active in church and lodge circles and a good roads booster.  
 Besides a widow he is survived by one son and one daughter. Ralph Reeves of Lebanon is the son and Mrs. Ray Smith of Salem the daughter. A number of Albany friends will attend the funeral tomorrow.—Albany Democrat.  
 Mr. Reeves was a cousin of Maurice Townsend of Turner and was well known here and at Salem.  
 Additional advances to producers of wheat who are members of the Oregon Cooperative Grain Growers have recently been mailed from the headquarters office in Portland. This additional distribution of funds has been made possible by the sales of the organization during the past few months which exceed original advances. It raises the total now in the hands of members to from 65 cents to 75 cents a bushel, and amounts in all to \$226,719.  
 In Marion county alone more than \$20,000 has been received by members of the association.  
 The cooperative organization takes pleasure in sending out these additional funds," declared A. H. Lee, general manager of the Oregon Cooperative Grain Growers in discussing the payments. "It is our intention always to have in the hands of the members every cent returned from their wheat which can be placed and still leave us a safe margin for operations. The amount of advances at the present time in several localities practically equals the average price received by unorganized growers who sell during the low markets of last fall and early winter, and we still have several million bushels of wheat in the northwest pool to sell before a complete average for the year's operations is made."
