### To Remove Lead in a Gunbarrel.

Chemically pure and strong nitric acid will dissolve the lead and not attack the metal of a gunbarrel unless water. To remove the acid, pour all on a large scale. Some breeders prefer to raise all the goslings with hens, as geese sometimes become difficult to manage when al lowed to hatch and rear their young. Hens used for hatching goose eggs must be dusted with insect powder and have good attention as the period of incubation for goose eggs is longer than for chicken eggs. Goose eggs may be hatched in incubators and the gosling raised in brooders, but this

is not a common practice.

From 28 to 30 days are required to hatch goose eggs. Moisture should be added after the first week if the eggs licious meat. 
