To Form County Health Asso.

A mass meeting will be called Saturday, June 3, at 1:30 P. M., at the First M. E. church of Salem. At this time, those interested will form an organization known as the Marion County Public Health Association.

With the desire to keep abreast of the other counties in the better health movement, many Marion county citizens have felt that an association should be formed similar to that existing in 17 other Oregon counties. In this way there is made possible the uniting for organized effort of those vitally interested in the promotion of health.

Throughout the entire world, people are awakening to the necessity and desirability of safeguarding health. There is much talk of economy, and we know that sickness is a source of great individual and public expense. Millions of people are beginning to plan themselves on keeping in the pink of physical condition.

It will be the purpose of the new organization to promote health ideas to better health conditions, to work in many ways for the increasing of knowledge of correct living, to disseminate literature concerning disease prevention, to hold baby and tuberculosis clinics, to arrange for health talks, and eventually, when conditions are ripe, to take steps to secure a county public health nurse.

Every December, when Christmas seals are sold, the county association will retain one-fourth of the sale proceeds for use within Marion county.

Everyone wanting to see such an association created should feel his responsibility to the extent that he attend the meeting and contribute of his enthusiasm and cooperation.

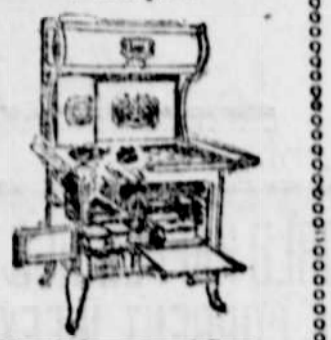
