Great Britain Bars Feathers.

No more feathers can enter Great have feathers in their hats are the pure, containing no insects, fell, froze ers, bird of paradise plumes, and all rican ostriches and elder ducks are the only exceptions to the law, as the plumage of both species can be obinined without cruelty while they are moulting. The new law does not ap-a ply to passengers coming into the country with feathers as part of their personal apparel. Birds of paradise recently have been killed at the rate of 30,000 a year in full breeding plumage, and as many as 300,000 albatrosses were killed in one raid in the Pacific. Florida has been swept clean of egrets, whole colonies of these birds onving been butchered at the breeding season to obtain the feathers some times known as "ospreys."

Are the Pleiades Dimmor?
