The parade in Washington a few days ago, when the Catholic Holy Name society marched through the streets of Washington, D.C., caused the same people of the country to think. In the parade were reported to be more than 1000 of the Philadelphia police force in full uniform, with their guns strapped on their backs containing 50 rounds of ammunition. Also a large number of policemen, who were also claimed to be armed, from New York. About 50,000 were said to be in the parade.

President Coolidge, as chief executive of the nation, was compelled to address the crowd. He gave them a good strong lecture on the constitution and told them that they must obey the law. Was this parade a demonstration against the national government or was it a peaceful parade? Whatever it was intended to be, it was a violation of the law, as everyone knows who has studied history or the American Constitution. The law prohibits any armed force from marching through the national capital or the District of Columbia except by permission of the commissioners of the District sanctioned by the war or the navy departments, or both. If more than 1000 armed men with a good supply of ammunition does not constitute an armed force, what does?

If such as this is a crime the guilty ones should be punished, no matter what their religion or politics. If it is in accordance with the law, then drop it or change the laws.

WE HAVE EXAMINED copies of the documentary evidence as to the effect of a state income tax upon Oregon. We are satisfied as to the genuineness of the documents.

We find that this evidence substantiates the claim that millions of dollars have been diverted from investment in Oregon industries that would provide a home market for Oregon agricultural products.

We find the damage is so serious and of such extent that we appeal to our neighbors and to voters in all parts of Oregon to vote for the repeal of the present income tax and to oppose the enactment of any new state income tax bill, at least until such time as the other Pacific Coast states have enacted similar legislation so they cannot grow at Oregon's expense.
