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RUINING THE RIVERS OF OREGON

The above is the title of a bulletin put out by the State Game Commission regarding the polluting of the rivers and streams in Oregon. The dumping of all manner of filth in the streams not only kills the fish but makes the water unfit for domestic use. The bulletin says in part that the dumping of waste from the mills and factories that are springing up along our streams and the combined filth of the rapidly growing cities and towns that is dumped into the streams is growing to such an extent that they are becoming as open sewers.

This common practice of dumping filth into the streams will in time kill off the trout, salmon and other food fish and our rivers will become depleted of fish as many of our Eastern streams are already. A sawmill dumps refuse into the stream and the owners are haled into court and fined. The bulletin then asks the question: "Why is a pulp or woolen mill allowed to wash its acids and dyes and other waste into public waters?"

The general laws of Oregon for 1921, Section 70, Chapter 153, according to E. F. Averill, of the Game Commission, clearly provide that it is an offense against the state for any person or corporation to corrupt or impair the quality of public waters so they cannot be used for domestic or municipal purposes.

If this be true why are there not more convictions?

There is a movement on foot to bring about the establishment of an experimental station in this district for the production of flax. This is something that is needed in this section. The section between Turner and Stayton is bound to become the banner flax district of the Willamette Valley. With the establishing of an experiment station in connection with the Oregon Agricultural College and the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture. These experiments are needed to determine what soils are adapted to flax under the various conditions which prevail in the valley and also to make tests for irrigation and dry land culture of this crop.

Flax cannot be raised on any kind of land the grower may see fit to plant to this crop. To raise any crop successfully the soil must be tested to learn which crop is best fitted for it. This can be done scientifically or practically. The station usually follows both methods. An experiment station for this section would be a big boost for the flax industry.

The public is silent regarding Senator Stanfield's senatorial campaign. Possibly he calls that a frame-up also.

FLAX MEETING SATURDAY

Farmers in the Turner district who are interested in flax growing will have an opportunity next Saturday afternoon, at the Salem Chamber of Commerce to hear both Prof. J. T. Jardine and Prof. G. R. Hyslop of the Oregon Agricultural College.

At the invitation of flax growers in the southern part of the county, both of the O.A.C. professors have agreed to speak at Salem next Saturday afternoon on flax growing, irrigation and fertilizing. Also give their experience in the proper methods of growing flax.

The Aumsville district has asked of the Oregon Agricultural College that an experimental station be established along the lines of flax growing.

The meeting Saturday afternoon at the Chamber of Commerce, Salem, will be called at 2 o'clock. All who are interested in flax growing are invited to attend.

There will be a meeting of the flax growers of the Turner-Aumsville district at Hines Hall, at Aumsville, at 7:30 p.m. The purpose of this meeting is to get things lined up for the Saturday afternoon meeting at the Chamber of Commerce rooms. Everyone interested in flax should attend this preliminary meeting.

Farm Pointers

O. A. C. Exp. Station.

Potatoes jobbed with forks or that are cut are not No. 1 potatoes. Special care should be taken to avoid mechanical injury, says the O.A.C. experiment station.

Very smutty seed wheat should not be planted, reports the O.A.C. station. Reasonably clean seed wheat may be given the copper carbonate treatment and smut will be effectively controlled. The formaldehyde treatment is the best treatment known for winter oats and barley. Full directions for treating may be had from the county agent or college.

If pullets have been properly bred and reared six to six and a half months is soon enough for them to come into egg production, the O.A.C. experiment station reports. Their bodies are good sized and strong enough to stand a little forcing if they had good summer range and are given plenty of grain. They are best changed gradually from the developing mash to the laying mash over a period of 10 days. Some of the laying mash moistened with buttermilk is then given them at noon for two weeks at the rate of five pounds of mash per 100 birds. They are in their permanent quarters during this period.

Seed corn selected from the fields already cut or that is still to be selected from the field should be dried as soon as possible, says the Oregon station. Some growers do this on seed corn trees, made by driving finishing nails into 2x2 sticks three feet long. The butts of the ears of corn may be stuck over the nails, thus keeping them separate and allowing for good drying. The trees are hung to rafters. Other growers hang the ears up by strings, and still others dry the corn in hop or prune dryers. With good ventilation it is safe to dry with a temperature of 140 degrees Fahrenheit.
