A new bill is to be sponsored at the next session of Congress by Senators McNary and LaFollett, to increase the pensions of the civil war veterans to \$100 per month. According to this bill the widows pensions are to be increased in like proportion. The ranks of the veterans are thinning fast and they should be able to enjoy the best there is in memory of their work in defending and holding the Union together during the trying times of the Civil War. The rapid thinning of the ranks of the veterans has left a large surplus in the Civil War pension fund. What better use could it be put to than apportioning it out to the veterans who are still with us.

The new eleven-story bank building in Salem seems to worry Editor Hassler of the Gervais Star to the extent that he gets extremely jealous of any one who admires the spirit of progress in the City of Salem. In an editorial in a recent edition of the Gervais Star, he referred to some one who gawked so long heavenward that it was some time before the crick was extracted from his neck. It was said to be either the editor or the hotel keeper from Turner. He ended his "enlightening and educational article" by saying—"Of course some people are disposed to rub, necking, both at high and low elevations." We can assure our critic that our eyes are high enough from the ground that we are able to discern that others go about with their hat over their eyes so that sometimes they even pass their friends without seeing them. As far as gazing at high buildings are concerned, we are used to that, as even Turner has a four-story building, and we are not sure but what that is more than Gervais can boast of. If he would spend more time looking at the high buildings he might see more of the good things of the world. We would rather "gawk" heavenward than at things under our feet.

WHAT SAFEGUARDS

It is pertinent to ask how any assurance can be given that bonds under the housewives' power scheme can be paid from earnings at maturity. All depends on successful operation. If interest is not earned, the general fund of the state is tapped. So also for principal, at need. No safeguards of any kind are provided. It means a new bond issue to provide for further operation, or a refunding of those already outstanding. All is in the hands of a political board. The public will be confronted with increased rates, or that general fund will be reduced.

We heard this remark the other day: "Turner is getting deader all the time." Right here we want to cite some of the improvements that have been carried out since we have been here. We have a paved street through town, a row of roses two blocks long along Third street; a fine concrete church building that would be a credit to Portland; the S. P. depot has been moved to make way for a street to be opened up through town connecting the Cloverdale market road with the Mill City road, which will probably be paved or oiled within the next two years. A substantial cream station is under construction for the Portland-Damascus Milk Co., which when completed will be an attractive addition to the city; a Salem attorney has commenced the erection of what will be one of the finest residences in our city. All this in three years time is pretty good for a town that is "getting deader all the time."
